pl.obj-stoma-attached-thing
'lunchbox (with two handles)'
7. a-huu-ja?t-i
sg-stoma-attached-thing
~~thing~~ 'pitcher'
8. a-ja?t-i
sg-attached-thing
'fish'
9. jii-?uu-ja?t-vvka
1s-stoma-attached-immed.pst
'I just now attached a handle to something (e.g. a bucket)'
10. a-huu-ja-woolat-i
sg-stoma-attached-protrude-thing
'lamp chimney'

Cherokee grammatical morphs may be inert syntactically.

11. t-aa-khiyvv-sto-ska
pl(nostrils)-sg-nose-be pushed- pres
'he or she is sneezing'
12. t-uunii-yoosih-a
pl(stomachs)-3p.subj-hungry-pres
'they are hungry'
13. t-aa-kowhti-a
pl-3sg-see-pres
'he/she sees them'
14. taa-naa-tee-lohkwa-a
pl.obj-3p.subj-iter-learn-pres
'they are learning multiple things'
15. tii-tee-hlokwaa-ski
pl.obj-iter-hlokwaa-exper
'student' learn
16. tii-na-tee-lokwaa-ski
pl.obj-pl-iter-learn-exper
'students'
17. juu-na-tee-lokwaa-sti
loc-3p.exper-iter-lokwaa-instr
'school' learn

Object-shape classifiers may be used alone as predicates.

18. ka-naa?a
3s-flexible obj-pres
'It (something flexible) is there (somewhere low).'
